**Check with your university study abroad office about semester tuition fees to study abroad at The Beijing Center.

1) TBC semester tuition base rate, which includes: 12 to 19 credit hours, two-week academic excursion, airport pickup/drop-off, 24-hour on-site support, orientation in Beijing (activities, most meals, speakers), individual Chinese language tutor, day trips in and around Beijing, initial meal stipend.

2) Housing fee includes UIBE on-campus WIFI internet in Building 8.

3) Students receive a campus dining card with approximately \$50 complimentary credit for campus dining.

4) Non-TBC fees. Additional processing in China required: physical exam, resident permit, internship annotation fee, and processing fee.

5) Students receive a stipend for utilities (RMB100 for water and RMB100 for electricity).
